Fr Phillip writes...

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

Firstly, may I say a profound "thank you" to Fr Kevin for the many years of dedicated and loving care and ministry he has brought to you all in St Francis of Assisi, Ascot. May he enjoy now his well-earned years of retirement. It is a privilege to follow on from him here and I am looking forward to getting to know you all as your priest and pray that the Lord will help and support us all in our onward journey and mission as faithful Catholics in the coming years.

This Sunday's readings present us with the establishment of the Ten Commandments (Ex 20:1-17), St Paul's reflection on our faith in the Lord Jesus, crucified for us (1 Cor 1:22-25) and Jesus cleansing the temple in the Gospel reading (John 2:13-25).

The giving of the Law was important in helping to form and guide God's people yet, with time, it was taken advantage of for personal gain as we hear in the Gospel. So Jesus overthrows the money-changers' and the pigeon sellers' tables and purifies the temple. This is a prelude to and a reflection of what he came into our world to do: to cleanse us all from the corruption of sin and wickedness by his saving sacrifice on the Cross.

By dying on the Cross for us and rising again on Easter Day he has transformed our lives and our relationship with God. So like St Paul we can see our mission and our calling: "here are we preaching a crucified Christ... a Christ who is the power and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength."

Let us, as faithful Catholic Christians here at St Francis of Assisi in Ascot, continue to put our trust and faith in our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ this Lent and help others also to recognise and come to him.
